Constitution and By-Laws
Revised September 2025

Article I

The official name shall be Parent Teacher Organization for Exceptional Children Inc. Notwithstanding any term or condition of these By-Laws. PTOEC shall comply with the Special Olympics Illinois General Rules to the full extent applicable to the organization. The provision of these Bylaws shall be interpreted in a manner which is consistent with this intent.

Article II

Mission Statement

The mission of the organization is to provide planned recreational activities, socialization opportunities, and instructional opportunities for intellectually impaired individuals in the Metro East area without regard to sex, race, religion, or national origin. As a part of its mission, the organization strives to provide worthwhile information and programming for parents as well as to increase community awareness, not only to the needs of the intellectually impaired but positive awareness of their strengths, attributes and dignity.

Article III

Membership

Membership is open to all persons with an intellectual disability or cognitive delay as identified by an agency or professional; as well as their family members, guardians, caregivers, and all persons interested in the welfare of those who have intellectual disabilities. PTOEC shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, creed, color, national or ethnic origin, sex, age, or disability.

There shall be two types of membership:

- Individual membership-includes individual athletes; or, a teacher, volunteer, coach, unified partners, board members or other community members interested in the welfare of persons with intellectual disabilities.
- Family Members- includes any combination of persons living in a family setting, including a caregiver who has legal guardianship or power of attorney for the special needs individual(s) and the athletes(s) living with them; spouses; siblings; and other persons who are interested in the welfare of those with intellectual disabilities, who are living as a family.

In addition, individual members will be those who are current in payment of dues; the amount of dues for membership to be decided by the Board of Directors. In the event that a member cannot pay dues due to financial hardship, the Board may choose to waive that membership requirement, upon an annual hardship request.

There will be an official membership list PTOEC and only names appearing thereon will be considered official members of the organization. The membership list will be updated periodically or at least once yearly.

The board may, by a $\frac{2}{3}$ vote of those present at a Board meeting, remove any member who has demonstrated activities or actions that are detrimental to the purpose and reputation of the organization.

Whenever possible and prudent, if a proposal requires a vote, and that proposal affects the athletes directly, the board of directors will present those decisions to the athletes for a vote. In such cases, each athlete in good standing will be allowed to vote.

- Each individual member will be allowed one vote
- Each family membership will be allowed one vote per family

Article IV

Section A-General Responsibility

The Board of Directors will be responsible for the overall operation, fiscal management, and policies of the organization; including the organization and coordination of programming, the hiring/termination of employees, annual budget recommendations, paying day to day bills and other necessary activities to ensure the smooth operation of the organization.

Section B - Composition

The board shall consist of a minimum of 9 with a maximum of 11 members. Membership on the board may be achieved in one of two ways as follows:

- a. Candidates are nominated by a board member and accepted by the majority of board members present at an official meeting. In October, the board will conduct a search for new board members by inviting interested persons of the general membership and interested members of the community. In November, the recruitment committee will present a slate of prospective board members to the board. Selected candidates will be invited to the December meeting to introduce themselves: sitting members will then vote to accept or reject the candidates.
- b. A candidate is elected at a special election by receiving 50% plus one of the PTOEC members who vote in the special election. A majority of Board members may call for a special election or a majority of PTOEC members may call for a special election. If called, the election will be held within 45 days of the call and written ballots will be employed.

Section C - Executive Officers

The board shall elect from its members the following executive officers: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Recording Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary. These officers will be elected and voted on in the December meeting by its members of the next year's Board of Directors. Each elected executive office will hold office for a one-year period. The majority of the Board will appoint temporary officers to serve the remainder of the term if a vacancy occurs.

Section D - Meetings

The board of directors will meet at least monthly, September through May, and may hold special meetings at the discretion of the Board President or a majority of the board members. A quorum of more than half of the current board will be required to conduct business. Meetings will be held at a time and place selected by the board. All meetings are open to the general membership; however they may be closed to discuss specific topics deemed by a majority of the board to be sensitive in nature. Minutes of each board meeting will be taken by the Recording Secretary and posted on the PTOEC website.

Prior to each January meeting of the Board of Directors, the Board Members shall review the Bylaws and recommend any necessary changes to the Board of Directors for full vote.

The rules contained in the current edition of Roberts' Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall govern the Board of Directors in all matters in which they apply provided they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation statute, or any special rules of governance the Board of Directors may adopt (A summary of those rules that most pertain to nonprofit organizations is accessible at <https://www.boardeffect.com/blog/roberts-rules-of-order-cheat-sheet>)

Section E - Standing Committees

The standing committees deemed necessary for the successful delivery of services by the organization will be chaired by one or more board members who will be responsible for obtaining committee members, holding meetings and making recommendations for action and financial expenditures to the board of directors. The committees will be created whenever it is deemed necessary.

Section F - Term Limitations

Each board member shall serve a minimum of a 3 year term with a maximum of 5 years if no individual or person in that term is interested in serving. Provision only applies if a spot can not be filled through open member solicitation. Former board members may continue to serve as members of standing committees for as long as they wish.

Section G - Compensation

Board members shall serve without compensation.

Section H - Resignation

Any board member may resign by providing written notice to the board. The board will find a replacement board member in a timely manner following the same general guidelines outlined in section IV B above.

Section - I Removal of Directors

The board may, by a two-thirds vote of those present at an official board meeting, remove any of its members who have demonstrated activities or actions that are detrimental to the purpose and reputation of the organization.

The entire board may be removed by the membership by a vote of two-thirds of the entire membership at the annual meeting.

Article V Dissolution

The PTOEC organization may be dissolved by $\frac{2}{3}$ vote of the Board of Directors recommending to the general membership that such action is warranted. Upon dissolution, all just debts shall be paid to creditors. Any equipment will be donated to other agencies dealing with the intellectually impaired. Any funds remaining will also be donated to agencies serving the intellectually impaired.

Article VII Fiscal Policy

Section A - Fiscal Policy

The organization's fiscal year will be from January 1 of any given year to December 31 of the same year.

Section B - Checks and Fund Transfers

Normally, all transactions will be conducted by check and debit-credit card. Amounts that exceed any item in the annual approved budget line will require two signatures. Authorized signatures shall be the President, Vice-President or Treasurer. Payments of the amounts authorized in the annual budget may be signed by the President or Treasurer. Opening or closing of accounts will require board approval.

Section C - Budget

The board will pass an annual budget of proposed and anticipated expenditures with that budget being balanced or showing a surplus. Deficit spending may be approved by the board under special circumstances; however no deficit amounting to more than $\frac{1}{3}$ of the reserves may be approved.

Section E - Indebtedness

The Organization will not be allowed to borrow funds for operational expenses. Borrowing for long term acquisitions will require $\frac{2}{3}$ board approval.
